A Classic Returns



At **PSRD**, we aim to spread the word about discoveries in planetary science by writing about exciting and fascinating research published in scientific journals. Our **archives** are full of examples. Another way to explain science is to incorporate it into a story. That's what friends (mutually fascinated by petrology, space, and the allure of a well-turned tale) Ron Fodor and Jeff Taylor did a long time ago when they wrote the thriller **IMPACT!** It's a story centering around the threat of a big Earth-crossing asteroid that is heading right at us. Yes, the story contains meteorite and impact science along with sleazy government officials, international intrigue, and the usual "interpersonal activities" common in thrillers.

In his 1982 book *Planetary Science: A Lunar Perspective*, Ross Taylor wrote, ⁶⁶ A fictional account of a scenario involving meteorite impacts with the Earth has been provided by Fodor and Taylor. A vivid eyewitness account of an impact is given on p. 62-65 and an excellent description of a freshly formed meteorite crater (4.2 km diameter, 750 m deep, rim height 40 m above the Kansas plain), a little larger than Arizona's Meteor Crater, appears on p. 104-108. Those who wish to toil through descriptions of numerous erotic episodes will find much useful information on meteorites

and on the phenomena of impact in this book. (Page numbers refer to the paperback original.)

IMPACT! has been out of print for a long time, but is **now available** as a Kindle eBook. So, for a great time, read *IMPACT!* written by R. V. Fodor and G. J. Taylor. It's a classic!
